- Foster collaboration and knowledge exchange among researchers, practitioners, policymakers, and industry experts working on AI in the Global South and other underrepresented regions.

Conference Structure and Activities:

The conference welcomes experts and scholars from the world, especially from Global South countries, as well as media and communications professionals to showcase their research, projects, and initiatives through paper presentations, poster sessions, and demo sessions.

Expected Outcomes:

The conference aims to achieve the following outcomes:

- Generate new knowledge and insights on AI in the Global South.
- Build a network of researchers, practitioners, policymakers, and industry experts working on Al in the Global South.

- Develop a roadmap for inclusive and sustainable AI adoption in Global South and unerrepresented developing countries.
